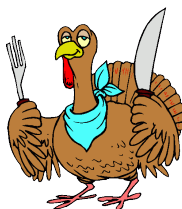


Big thank you to the Flower Guild for their work in beautifying the church; and we thank all of you who donated the garden harvest/produce and non-perishable food items.
