PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY

Every so often we find that a parishioner has been in hospital or unable to come out to church and Stephen and I haven't known, so we can visit or call. As the colder weather approaches, please let us know if you notice someone is missing or that you have concerns about. When health challenges arise, that is especially when we want to be supportive. I am also continuing to look for people willing to be pastoral visitors. You would only have one or two people to visit per month, depending on the amount of time you have to give to the ministry. A pastoral visitor's training course is required and is available periodically through the diocese or Major Mackenzie Hospital. Even if you are away for some of the winter, visiting can be done when you're available. Please give this some thought, it can be very rewarding.

I want to remind you that I have a library of health related books and articles. There are Alzheimers and caregiving materials, heart and stroke, nutrition and immunization, depression, resources; a wide variety of materials that previous parish nurse and I have gathered. Please consider contacting me if any of it may be helpful, or if you have questions.

Our Remembrance and Hope service Dec 7 at 7:30 pm is a good way to help all who are grieving over this up-coming holiday time. Even if it has been a few years, the loss of a loved one can be felt acutely at special times like Christmas. I will be putting out materials for advent to help with grieving during this time, as well. One sheet can be used with the advent wreath. These handouts will be at the back of the church from the first Sunday of Advent.
