

Parish Selection Committee Update

as of November 14, 2022

It's been some time since we provided you with an update on the search for our new priest. You may recall that we were under a "cone of silence" during the latter part of the selection process to maintain confidentiality. However, we can now provide you with an update on where we are with our search.

The situation we are in is not unusual or unique to Holy Trinity.

After the parish profile was posted on the diocesan and national church websites over the summer, Bishop Andrew planned to review the applications and provide us with a shortlist of candidates to interview.

Unfortunately, no applications have yet been received so we don't have any candidates to interview. It should be noted that this is not an unusual situation or one that's unique to Holy Trinity. Older clergy are retiring and fewer new priests are coming up. Many churches are in a fragile condition as they emerge from COVID, and priests who would otherwise be interested in the opportunity at

be an issue for some candidates.

Holy Trinity may be reluctant to leave their parishes at

this time. The cost of housing in our community may also

forward. We'll refresh the parish profile and repost it on the diocesan and national websites. We're also thinking about how we might use social media or other innovative techniques to broaden our search. Bishop Andrew has started reaching out to potential candidates and is quite open to receiving suggestions from us about possible candidates. The PSC made a few suggestions to the Bishop, and you should also feel free to bring forward names of clergy – both Anglican and Lutheran – that you think have potential.

A word of caution is in order here. We need to be careful not to be seen as poaching from another parish, and we must maintain the confidentiality of the process. If there is someone you'd like the Bishop to consider, you can provide the name to the wardens or a member of the PSC, and it will be forwarded to Bishop Andrew. The Bishop will in turn decide if the person is a suitable

candidate that he should approach. Please don't approach them yourself. If you're thinking about who a suitable candidate might be, the introduction to the parish profile sets out the skills and experience that a potential candidate should have.

Bishop Andrew has also encouraged us to use prayer to guide us and help us with our discernment in this process. To that end, we have started using a new prayer for parish selection to reflect our new circumstances.

We are encouraged to pray for guidance and discernment going forward.

Unfortunately, we don't know how much longer the selection process is going to take. We do know that the Diocese has been and continues to be focused on helping us find a new priest. We are fortunate that we have Canon Barb with us as our interim-priest-in-charge and we also have a tradition of strong lay and volunteer leadership that has allowed us to successfully manage lengthy interims in the past. Hopefully — and prayerfully — we won't have to do this for too much longer.
